Post Summary

• Applications are invited for a post-doctoral research fellow to join the SloWaters research team. SloWaters (https://slowaters.eu/). It aims to develop a portfolio of potential approaches and methodologies to reduce flood risk and generate cobenefits including sediment and nutrient attenuation and ecosystem enhancement. And is an EPA/OPW funded project led by Dr Mary Bourke. The tasks involve using established literature review and policy/practice synthesis techniques and learning from best practice We are recruiting a dynamic, energetic, highly motivated candidate who has proven expertise in reviewing literature (both scientific and policy/practice documentation) and synthesising this knowledge into short summaries. We are looking for the candidate to identify the policies and practices that present opportunities and challenges for implementing NBS for flood risk and diffuse pollution management in rural Ireland (linking this to the effectiveness of the approach).

There is potential to take position on a part-time basis, with working from home options.

Standard Duties and Responsibilities of the Post

- As a core member of the SloWaters research team, the candidate will be expected to review literature on past and recent policy and practice updates related to Nature-based solutions in peatland, forests, and agricultural landscapes in Ireland. They will produce literature reviews and syntheses findings from the reviews, analyse data (both quantitative and qualitative), and contribute to research papers and policy briefs.
- Linked to the above, review the effectiveness of the NBS approach in Ireland;
- The candidate will also support the projects dissemination and engagement activities, including the development of materials for social media and website, and presentation at academic conferences.
- The review may require the need to engage with stakeholders, particularly policy and practice (e.g., to attain further information).

Qualifications (Essential)

The successful candidate will hold a PhD in a relevant subject e.g. geography (either physical or social sciences – expertise in reviewing literature is essential).

Knowledge, skills & Experience (Essential & Desirable)

- Ability to review literature and produce short literature summaries. Must be able to review both scientific and grey literature (specifically policy and practice documentation).
- Excellent writing skills (both scientific and non-technical for stakeholders)
- Knowledge of NbS literature.
- Publication record, appropriate to career stage
- Experience with engaging with stakeholders particularly practitioners and policy makers.
- Experience in presenting research findings at (international) conferences
- Ability to work both independently and in a team, to think independently and to overcome difficulties in research process.

The Selection Process in Trinity

The Selection Committee (Interview Panel) may include members of the Academic and Administrative community together with External Assessor(s) who are expert in the area. Applications will be acknowledged by email. If you do not receive confirmation of receipt within 1 day of submitting your application online, please contact the named Recruitment Partner on the job specification immediately and prior to the closing date/time.

Given the degree of co-ordination and planning to have a Selection Committee available on the specified date, the University regrets that it may not be in a position to offer alternate selection dates. Where candidates are unavailable, reserves may be drawn from a shortlist. Outcomes of interviews are notified in writing to candidates and are issued no later than 5 working days following the selection day.

In some instances the Selection Committee may avail of telephone or video conferencing. The University's selection methods may consist of any or all of the following: Interviews, Presentations, Psychometric Testing, References and Situational Exercises.

It is the policy of the University to conduct pre-employment medical screening/full preemployment medicals. Information supplied by candidates in their application (Cover Letter and CV) will be used to shortlist for interview.
